<p>The textbook Essentials of Oceanography was mainly what I used to study. Dr. Carton is a very engaging lecturer, but the lecture slides themselves were difficult to interpret, as it was all diagrams and pictures with very few words. The Homework was more math and physics intensive than most students were expecting. I thought the exams were challenging, and though we were given practice quantitative problems, I think that a study guide would have helped tremendously since this class comes with a lot of information to memorize. The best part of this class was the group research project since it allowed students to take a specific topic and really go in depth as well as hone teamwork skills. Above all though this is a fun course complete with a field trip, and I hope that it continues in the years to come.</p>
<p>This course is very hard to get a good grade in for someone who doesn't excel in math or physics. The exams were heavily weighted on calculation problems and if you struggle in math, there is no chance the exam grade will be good. The written response questions were harshly graded.</p>
<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. For problem sets, I think there should be a few example problems done in class so that we can understand the type of questions that are going to be asked.2. The way the course was offered this semester is perfect! I liked having Friday lectures online and the rest in person. The field trip was one of the favorite things about the course.
<p>Course prof spoke very fast, which is why for me, the recorded panopto was ESSENTIAL to review— again and again— and to take notes on. Quite clearly, the professor knew his material, and if he didn't know an answer to a question outside his area of expertise, he said so. He is fair, kind and gracious. I would have liked more office hours available.</p> <p>There is one mystery though. I signed up for the course based on info on the AOSC course list. Later, I discovered it was co-listed on Geology— and suggested that we have various prerequisites. I think you ought to add that to the description in AOSC – Otherwise, students won't know what they are getting into. About a third of grades involve calculus. A person will need a lot of catch up— if he/she is not conversant.</p>
<p>I believe that you should explain how the math problems are done. Giving students random math problems that you haven't shown us how to do is extremely difficult. Then to put them onto our exams is completely unbelievable. I know more than half of the students in this class were just as clueless as I was as well. Please show us how to do some math problems before giving us homework and exams on stuff we don't know how to do.</p>
<p>The professor for this course did an amazing job teaching this course. He moved back to in person teaching very well while also utilizing the resources created during online learning to make sure accommodations were made for those who were sick and to just create more study resources for the course available to the students. He was a great teacher and made the course content engaging and made it fun to come to class each and every day. He clearly wanted to get to know the students and wanted the students to get to know each other. My only critique of the course is I wish there were more field trips.</p>

My only problem with this course is that, even though it says a physics based course was recommended, it just seemed like math was being thrown at me. Granted the math had its basis in oceanography but it seemed so disconnected from what we learned in lecture.</p>
